## **2. Question Paper Pattern**

- Divisions of marks should be according to syllabus.
- Two answer sheets will be provided one for Part-1 and another for Part-2. The second answer sheet will be issued after the student submits first answer sheet to the centre superintendent/invigilator.

## **3. Scheme of Examination**

- (1) The post-graduate degree course shall have two examinations in the following manner, namely:-
  - (a) the preliminary examination shall be conducted at the end of one academic year after admission;
  - (b) the final examination shall be conducted on completion of three academic years after the admission to postgraduate course;
  - (c) examination shall ordinarily be held in the month of June or July and November or December every year;
  - (d) for being declared successful in the examination, student shall have to pass all the subjects separately in preliminary examination;
  - (e) the student shall be required to obtain minimum fifty per cent. marks in practical and theory subjects separately to be announced as pass;
  - (f) if a student fails in preliminary examination, he shall have to pass before appearing in the final examination;
  - (g) if the student fails in theory or practical in the final examination, he can appear in the subsequent examination without requiring to submit a fresh dissertation;
  - (h) the subsequent examination for failed candidates shall be conducted at every six months interval; and
  - (i) the post-graduate degree shall be conferred after the dissertation is accepted and the student passes the final examination.

- (2) The examination shall be aimed to test the clinical acumen, ability and working knowledge of the student in the practical aspect of the specialty and his fitness to work independently as a specialist.
- (3) The clinical examination shall be judge the competence of the student in Ayurveda and scientific literature of the specialty.
- (4) The *viva-voce* part of the practical examination shall involve extensive discussion on any aspect of subject or specialty.

4. **TEACHING & MONITERING LEARNING PROGRESS for MD Scholars.**

- **Seminars:** The seminars shall be held at least once in a week in both post graduate departments. All candidates are expected to participate actively. Each candidate shall make at least 5 seminars in each year.
- **Journal club:** The journal review meeting shall be held at least once in week. All candidates are expected to participate actively. The candidate should make the presentation from allotted journals of selected articles at least 5 times in each year.
- **Symposium:** It is recommended to hold symposium on topics covering multiple disciplines.
- **Clinical postings for Clinical PG Courses:** Each trainee shall work in hospital on regular basis to acquire adequate professional skills and competency in managing various cases to be treated by the specialist.
  - In First year M.D. (Ayu) the students will have to work as junior residents. They will have to attend Indoor Hospital duties at least 3 to 5 hours a day where they will have to complete all the records pertaining to history taking and physical examination of the allotted patients.
  - In the second and the Third year M.D. (Ayu), the students will have to work as Senior Residents. They will have to complete all the Clinical records pertaining to the patients. They will have to assist the concerned physician/teacher in conducting hospital rounds and O.P.D. They will have to attend hospital emergencies and emergency night duties.
  - All the students will have to attend hospital duties on Sundays and Holidays also. They are required to take prior permission and approval of the Director, Principals of Institute on the recommendation of H.O.D. for going out of station during holidays. Such permission may be granted by the Director / Principals of institutes if there are sufficient reasons for it.
- **Practical for Non-clinical PG Courses:**
  - **For Ras-shastra Scholars:**
    - Minimum 150 practical's should be performed covering all the dosage forms.

- 10 clinical cases using different dosage form are to be studied and recorded for efficacy and ADRs(if any)
- **Conducting Lectures-teaching skills:** All the candidates shall be encouraged to take part in the undergraduate teaching programmes either in the form of lecturer or group discussion in their subjects.
- **Conducting/attending Conferences at various levels:** The candidate shall be encouraged not only to attend conference/workshop/advance course but also to present at least **Three papers in national seminars and One paper in international seminar competence during their training period.**  
**Two Papers must be published in UGC approved journal in which one paper preferably based on thesis research.**
- All PG Scholars should have taken minimum 20 Theory and Practical classes of BAMS in concerned subject.
- **Continued Medical Education programmes:** Each post graduate department shall organize these programmes on the regular basis involving the other institution. The candidates shall also be encouraged to attend the programme conducted elsewhere.
- **Practical records:** Records shall be maintained by the Head of the Department and shall be made available to the University or CCIM
